Really smart uniform.

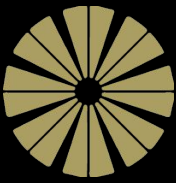

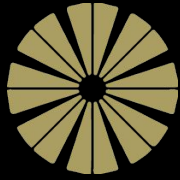


Uniform issues which can be resolved. For example - confiscation of jewellery, untucked shirt, blazer hidden away, skirt rolled.

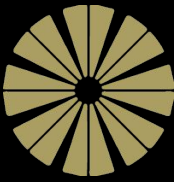

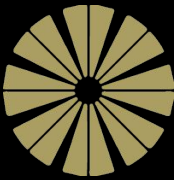
