


## Learning Leader Message



## Sixth Form Leadership Team Message

"Hi from the student leadership team, Sixth form is a great opportunity not only to expand your educational requirements but also prepare you for the world of work and a professional job. 

Psychology

Year 12 have been working on establishing their knowledge of approaches and linking this to their understanding of human attachment this term. Every couple of weeks the students take part in either group learning or group based Psychology research. Here the students were working out how to create samples for research. They have also recently carried out their own research into infant attachment and presented their findings to their peers.

## Reciprocal Reading

Students have been working in groups to carry out vital pre-learning of the content before covering the subtopic of Romanian orphan as a part of the Attachment for Paper 1 coverage. They enjoyed reading, summarizing, clarifying, questioning and predicting after reading about the research carried out by Rutter into the effects of deprivation.




English & Drama

## KS3 Music

This term students in Year 7 have been developing their understanding of the Musical Elements further and preparing performances of their Elements compositions.

Students in Year 8 extended their understanding of The Blues further by learning to play the 12-Bar Blues, walking bass line and even going so far as creating their own improvised riffs over a backing track using the C Blues Scale.

Students in Year 10 have been developing their performance skills and completing coursework for Unit 5. This culminated in them performing their 'Halfway Point' audition for Unit 5. All students did a fantastic job considering it was their first performance in front of others!

In Year 11 students have also been developing their musical repertoire as part of their Unit 2 studies. So far in this assignment they have created a plan for a musical event in school and now they are learning the repertoire for this performance! As well as Unit 2 students are also working to complete their Unit 3 work - this unit sees them developing their understanding of how to setup the equipment needed for a live musical performance.
