Careers

Students have been introduced to the guide for career options 2022 which is full of current apprenticeship providers ranging from technology and sales to Business, hospitality, retail and construction. National Apprenticeship week ran from 1st-7th March. Students were made aware of current apprenticeships available to them and any that required help with applications made an appointment with Mrs Bishop.

Year 10, 11, 12 and 13 are being urged to find a suitable placement for work experience and hand in their forms once they have done so. Mrs Bishop has recruited local businesses to assist some students that were finding it a struggle. Barnside Cattery, The Chestnuts nursing home and the Hazlitt Theatre are all new additions.

National Careers Week

National Careers week ran from 7th March to 11th. We managed to arrange suitable days that worked well with students revising for their mock examinations. On the Monday, Nuffield Health presented an inspiring talk on how to enter work in the fitness industry. Speakers consisted of a Fitness Manager, a Personal Trainer and Triathlete and a Membership Advisor. All gave a good account of what consisted in their job role and expected hours and salary. Thursday was a busy day starting with Charlton Athletic Community Trust. Michael Ward spoke about the variety of opportunities available to young people. He gave a very informative talk about apprenticeships in health improvement, youth services, football and sports development and nutrition. many questions asked with complete student engagement along with some added banter to and fro with regards to football teams and who supports who.

In the afternoon, Rob Johnson from Kings Estate Agents gave a detailed overview of how he started as an apprentice Estate Agent and also what Kings can offer our students.


