PUTIN FOUND RESPONSIBLE FOR SALISBURY POISONING DEATH!

Who is Putin?

Vladimir Putin is the Russian President and has been since 1999. Across his uninterrupted 27 years as leader he has ruled Russia with tyrannical brutality veiled by the facade of democracy and the ever complimentary reports of state owned media. Amongst his most influential acts for both Russia, its people and the rest of the world are: overseeing the elimination of his largest political opponent Alexei Navalny in 2024, launching Russia's invasion of sovereign Crimea in 2014 and ordering the start of Russia's 'Special military operation' in Ukraine which continues to claim lives even as you are reading. Before politics Putin was as an officer of the brutal, brazen Russian state security service, the KGB which oversees the elimination of anyone who opposes the Russian Federation.



Putin and the Perfume

What was the Salisbury Poisonings?

In the March of 2018 agents of the GRU (reorganised and expanded version of the KGB) attempted to kill retired British double agent Sergei Skripal. The GRU assassins smuggled into the country a 'Novichok' poison disguised in a perfume bottle. Novichok poisons are artificial nerve agents specifically designed to inflict pain and in this case death. Sergei had previously worked as a British spy handing Russian secrets to MI6 between the 1990's and early 2000's. This was the cause of the GRU attempted revenge assassination.

The agents sprayed the poison over the Skripal's door handle and then discarded the bottle. Sergei and his daughter were found unconscious and were rushed to hospital, where they were placed in intensive care and put into medical comas. Whilst the intended target survived and recovered the torturous tendrils of Novichok fulfilled their bloodthirst a few days later when unknowing Salisbury mother Dawn Sturgess was killed by what she believed to be perfume.

It is unknown how exactly Dawn Sturgess came into possession of the disguised Novichok, some believe it was given to her by a partner who found it in the street but it matters not how it got to her. Just 15 minutes after it touched her skin she began to feel its effects and 8 days later she was dead. The Inquiry into the events of that March was named in her honour 'The Dawn Sturgess Inquiry' and finished last December. They found Ms Sturgess' Death to be the result of actions undertaken by the GRU operatives and even went as far as resting responsibility on Vladimir Putin himself for ordering Russian agents to commit a breach of international law and disposing of the poison so carelessly. The inquiry also criticised MI5 (the organisation responsible for protecting Britain from external threats) for failing to stop and prevent the attack.

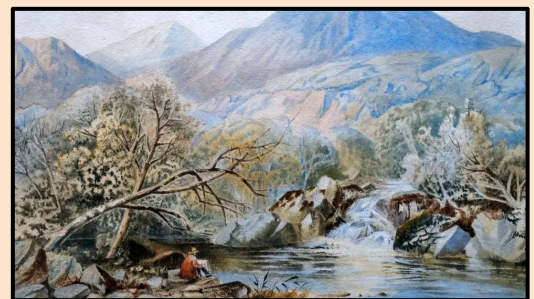

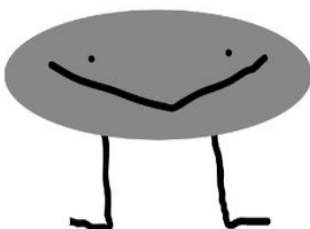

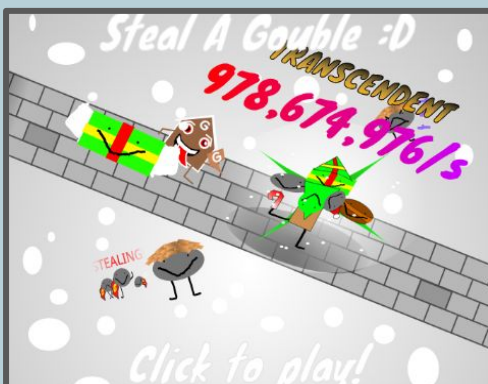

REMINDER: this game is still in the beta stages so there will probably be a couple of bugs and glitches. #stealagouble

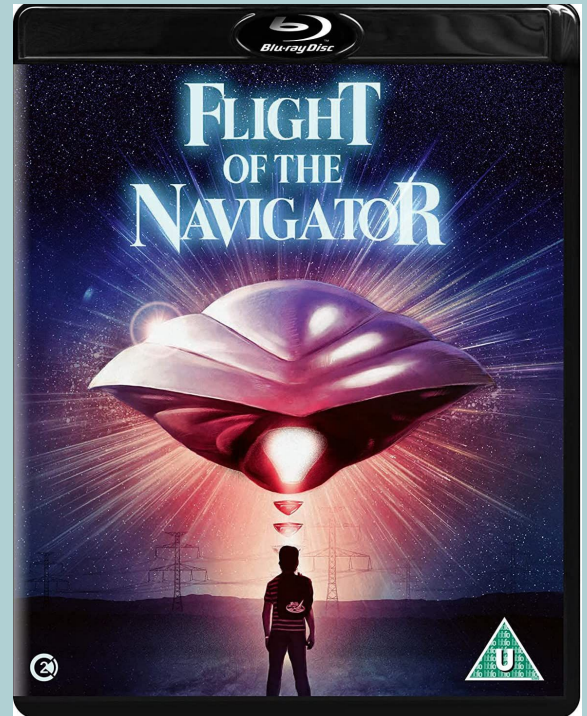
Film Reviews

30th January: *Peter Crouch:* English striker.



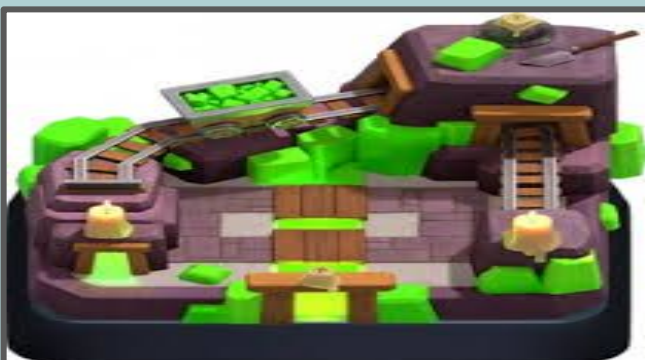
Clash Royale

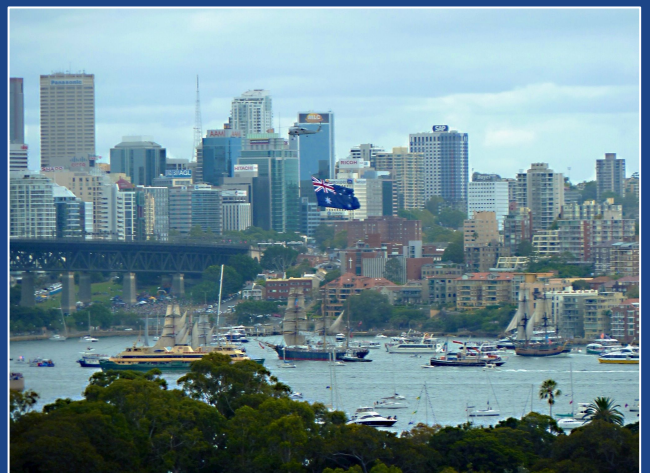
January Celebrations

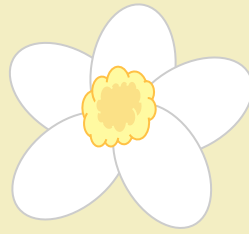
Diane listened, memorised, waited.

A Poem by Pat Roberts

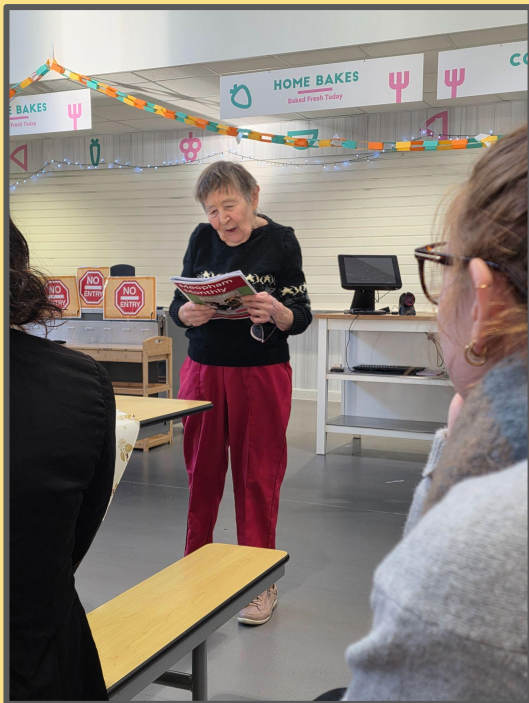
The difference between your world and mine.
