
Supporting your child

Research suggests that the following four routines have the biggest impact on children's development, self esteem, physical and mental health;

English



Maths



Science



History





Geography



French



Spanish



Philosophy






The Philosophy course covers a range of religions and ethical issues, developing understanding of the world around us. Art

Music



In Music students combine performance and theory skills, studying a range of musical genres and styles. They also have the opportunity to compose their own music.


Performing Arts

In Performing Arts students complete a range of units looking at different elements of performance, developing their skills with individual and group work throughout.




Catering

Sport



Sport students cover a range of units looking at health and fitness, training methods and sporting technique. They work independently and in a group to complete a range of practical and theoretical tasks.


Health and Social Care

Business



IT and Computing



IT students explore a range of issues such as project management, data handling and product design.


Personal Development





Students have a weekly lesson of Personal Development. In these lessons they explore Personal, Social, and Health education, as well as Relationships and Sex Education. These lessons are designed to help students understand their world, and how to keep themselves safe within it.

Core PE





Students continue to develop their physical skills in a range of sports and physical activities in a curriculum which focuses on teamwork and responsibility and encourages students to lead healthy, active lives.

<u>Homework</u>



In Key Stage 4 students receive weekly homework from all examined subjects. Each piece should take between 30 and 45 minutes to complete if done to a good standard.

All homework is set via Google Classroom. Homework can be a mixture of online activities, project work, and specific tasks as assigned by the teacher.
