Sixth form requirements

Meopham School Sixth Form

The minimum entry requirements for Meopham Sixth Form are 5 Level 4 GCSEs including English and Maths.



Minimum of 2 x Level 5 grades and 4 x Level 6 grades at GCSE. This must include a minimum of a grade 5 in English and Maths.



entry requirements for an individual subject and achieved at least five Grade 5's (or Merit) at GCSE or Level 2.




A Level pathway


Applicants can choose any 3 or 4 A Levels from different blocks.

These can be combined with IB diploma courses.

Minimum Entry Requirements: 5 x 9-4 at GCSE including at least a grade 4 in English and mathematics.

Entry Requirements



You will need a minimum of a Grade 4 in English and Maths or Science and other GCSEs at grade 3 and above. Alternatively, a previous achievement of a Level 1 qualification in Beauty. Your enrolment is subject to a successful interview, positive references/school report evidencing excellent attendance, behaviour and attitude and successful completion of 3 taster sessions to include assessment of your underpinning knowledge and technical ability.
